RESIDENCE PRIORITY

We are confident that the University will be able to offer on-campus housing to first-year students who apply and pay their residence deposit by the June 3, 2024, deadline.

First-year international students as well as first-year Canadian students who reside outside of Ontario are guaranteed on-campus housing as long as they apply and pay the residence deposit by June 3, 2024.

For all other first-year students, if demand exceeds supply, a lottery system will be used to allocate spaces. Students will be advised by mid-June if they have received a space in residence.

HOW WE DO ROOM ASSIGNMENTS

The University of Guelph uses a lottery system to complete room assignments. All first-year, incoming students with an offer of residence will receive a randomly-generated lottery number.

Preferences for room assignments must be indicated on your application form, including your preferred room and building type, and any residence learning communities of interest.

You are encouraged to include variety in your application in case your top preferences are no longer available when your lottery number is reached.

- Do I study better in a quiet living environment, or am I motivated by having lots of activity around me?
- Do I want to live in a single-gender, co-ed or genderinclusive community?
- Do I want to live with other students in the same academic program or who share common interests?
- Do I want to live with a roommate or prioritize a single room?



To apply for a Residence Learning Community (RLC):

On your Residence Application, you will be asked to select and rank your preferences for up to five residence communities. The RLC options are all listed as residence options, and you may select more than one.

Be sure to consider what's most important to you - the RLC, the building location, or the room type. If your desire to live in an RLC is higher than your desire for another building, rank it accordingly.









ACCESSIBILITY REQUESTS

Do you have unique circumstances that require an accommodation?

Additional consideration can be made in the room assignment process for students who require accommodations for medical, cultural/religious, mental health, or other personal reasons. The Accessibility Accommodation Form, which must be completed by an attesting professional, is due at the same time as your application on June 3, 2024.

The Accessibility Accommodation Form is embedded within your residence application. More details can be found on our website or by contacting the Residence Admissions team.

ROOMMATES & SUITEMATES

We think it's important for you to be comfortable living in a multi-occupancy room, suite or townhouse. Living with your peers provides opportunities to socialize and meet new people while creating a campus culture that is unique to the University of Guelph.

We have options for everyone, whether you have a preferred roommate or are ready to be matched with someone new!

You are invited to add a preferred roommate to your residence application after the June 1 deadline, provided you have both completed an on-time residence application and deposit. You can add 1 or 2 roommates in traditional residence, or up to 5 suitemates for our East Residence or East Village townhouses. You will be contacted to complete this process in mid-June.

I would like to be assigned a roommate at random

Many lifelong friendships begin in residence with someone you've never met before! On your Residence Application, we will ask you some questions about yourself that will help us to get to know you a little better so that we can try to find a match. It's important for you to be honest when you answer these questions to avoid potential future conflict.

I would only like a single room

Although the University of Guelph has over 2,000 single rooms available to first-year students, your assignment location is not guaranteed. We use a lottery process to complete room assignments and encourage variety in your application should your first choice be unavailable.

HOWTO APPLY

We make applying to residence easy!

1) Visit our website

housing.uoguelph.ca/apply has step-by-step instructions and a helpful walkthrough video to explain the process.

2) Browse our residences

Look through the different residences offered, including academic and living learning communities to decide your preferences for the application.

3) Enter the Housing Portal

This is where you will find the application and your user profile. Follow the prompts and fill out all the necessary information.

4) Submit your application

You will receive a confirmation email* if submitted successfully.

5) Pay the \$750 deposit

Using online banking (domestic applicants) or credit card (international applicants) before the June 3, 2024 deadline.

NOTE: Your application is not complete until the Application AND the Residence Deposit are received.

Meal Plans are available in different sizes to match your preferences and lifestyle. Your choice must be indicated in your residence application.


