Instructions

For this assignment, you are asked to reflect on the incident you were involved in and the impacts.

Please respond to the following questions:

- *Please outline the incident you were found responsible for. What decisions were made that led to this incident?*
- *Why do you feel these policies within the Residence Community Living Standards are in place?*
- *Aside from yourself, who was impacted by your actions? How were the individual(s) impacted?*
- *What does community mean to you? How would you describe your residence community, and what role do you play in this community?*
- *What would be the impact on you and your role in the community if you chose not to change your behaviour?*
- *How does your behaviour impact your future goals (academic, residence, personal)?*
- *How do you wish to move forward from this incident?*

Requirements

Length: Minimum of 500 words typed word document **OR** 3-5 minute Video submission
